A QUICK REFRESHER

Most people reading this are likely to be diehard NRLCEO fanatics with at least a couple years of experience. That being said, there is sure to be at least a few of you that are new to this and many more who could use a brush up on how to play.

Before we flood you with information in the rest of this season guide, take a second to look over everything below so that we're all starting off on the same foot.

WHAT IS NRLCEO?

NRLCEO is Australia's largest promotion/relegation draft for NRL fantasy football. Where Supercoach and NRL Fantasy assign prices to each player and give you a salary cap, NRLCEO prefers the draft approach. Every player is available to be in your team, but they're all unique. CEOs (that's you and the other players in your league) take turns to pick players, but once they've been picked nobody else can use them.

FROM YOUR FELLOW CEOS:

- "Draft 'til the end. While other people might be happy to pick up random players, you can find one or two gems."

AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST PROMOTION/RELEGATION DRAFT

The Legends of League Competition is our oldest public league and it is now in its eleventh year. It's the ultimate competition to pit yourself against the best of the best outside of your private leagues.

Such is the popularity of this competition that many of the teams have been returning since the first year. Still after 11 years, no team has ever won the Champions League twice. So the challenge is on for 2020 Champions Madz Mongrels and the 2019 Champions NQ All Stars as they attempt to win for a second time.

Our Legends of League tournament is Australia's biggest promotion and relegation fantasy draft tournament.

The top tier is made up of ten teams. The top four from the 2020 Champions League and the six winners of the Legends of League Division 1 competitions. They all vye for the honour of being the champion of all champions, the highest honour in the NRLCEO world.

The second tier is made up of six Legends of League competitions with eight teams in each league. The winner of each of these competitions competes in the next year's Champions League. The bottom two teams are relegated to the third tier.

The third tier is made up of six qualifying leagues. There are eight teams in each competition and the Grand Finalists of each of these competitions get promoted to tier two the following year.

In each of these competitions, the top five play-off in the finals to crown the champion of each League. It is \$10 entry per team and the winners receive an awesome trophy. There are limited places available in the tier three competitions depending on who returns.



CHAMPIONS LEAGUE INTERVIEW

- WITH ADAM BROWNLEE

Q. How long have you been playing NRLCEO?

A. I have been playing NRLCEO for as long as I can remember. I began playing Fantasy NRL in 2003 in VNRL if i can remember correctly. I have not missed a season since.

Q. Is this your greatest victory of all?

A. This would have to be my greatest victory in NRLCEO. I have been trying to earn a spot in the Champions League for a few years. I had a few GF losses in the Legends of League along the way, so this win is very sweet, especially in my first season in Champions League.

Q. Do you have a standard draft strategy that you follow?

A. My standard draft strategy is probably similar to most. Early picks are of course used to build a workhorse pack. I will normally take a kicker in Round 2 or 3 (depending on what others are doing). I try to get a kicker from a team that is capable of playing finals.

I will forgo picking gun outside backs early as I can find a potential gun later in the draft, Stephen Crichton a prime example of that.



Q. Who was your first draft pick in the Champions League and were you happy with him?

A. My first pick this season was Damien Cook with pick #1 overall. I just couldn't go past him. His points were slightly down from the last two seasons but still ahead of the rest.

Q. Who was the worst player you drafted in the Champions League in 2020?

A. The worst player I drafted this season was Blake Ferguson. I carried him in my team for most of the season. Nat Butcher a close second.

Q. What makes the Champions League different to other comps you play in?

A. The Champions League is the best of the best. You cannot luck your way into this league. It is different to other leagues because everyone has had to earn their spot. Add to that the pressure of finishing in the top four just to stay in the league.

Q. How was the pressure in the final few weeks?

A. The pressure during the finals was actually huge. I went 14-2 for the season with an average of 100. I knew it would only take one bad week and I was in trouble. I actually lost in the last round before the finals as well so I was nervous. I won the major semi only scoring 80, I was relieved to get to the GF. I needed 115+ to win the GF which I managed to overcome.

Q. How did you feel when you realised you won the Champions League?

A. The feeling when I realised I had won was relief mostly. I did not want to waste such a good season. After that I was stoked.

Q. If you get second pick in the draft in 2021, who will you pick?

A. If I get second pick in this year's draft I will be happy to take Cook again if he doesn't go first pick. Otherwise I would pick Payne Haas.

Q. Who will be your biggest rival in the Champions League in 2021?

A. I think Jason Mills and I have developed a nice rivalry leading into next season. What an effort from him to almost be the first to go back to back. He beat me once during the regular season but I had him covered when it mattered.

- Q. In nine seasons of the Champions League, there have been nine separate winners. How do you plan on being the first ever person to win it twice?
- A. Nine seasons, Nine different winners. It's actually not a huge surprise to me that we have not had back to back winners. That will change this year. I think the trick is to not take it lightly just because you won the previous season. I'll be treating it like I haven't won it yet.

- Q. What made you want to throw \$250 on the line in the name of fantasy footy?

NEW PODCAST EPISODES EVERY WEEK

Traditionally in our Supporters Leagues you get to pick your team from real life and draft six of their players, as well as the team's kicking points, before anyone else gets the chance. We found that some teams who typically flail down the bottom of the ladder don't always have six players worth picking, so we've decided to tweak the rules a bit.

Starting in 2021, all NRLCEO players in a Supporters League **now only pick four players** plus their team's kicking points. This should help even out the teams and make the draft that much more interesting.

Example:

If you have the Melbourne Storm, then you're likely to pick up Harry Grant, Ryan Papenhuyzen, Josh Addo-Carr, and perhaps Cameron Munster or Jahrome Hughes. In years gone past you wouldn't have to make that choice, and you might have thrown in an extra forward. Now, either Munster or Hughes are going to be in the draft, and the poor bastard who has the Tigers might actually have a shot!

SUPER LEAGUE SCOUTING

It's a very different looking group of players heading to the NRL from the Northern Hemisphere this year. Whether it is COVID related or just scouting tactics are changing. I'm not sure.


Most of the Super League recruits this year haven't even made their mark on the Super League yet. They are long term prospects. Three of them aren't yet 20 years old.

Ben Murdoch-Masila is the highest profile recruit from the Super League. He has spent the past five seasons in the UK for the Salford Red Devils (2016-17) and Warrington Wolves (2018-20). He has racked up 128 appearances and has scored 42 tries, which is very impressive for a big boy. But we've seen players from the Super League come over with massive try scoring strike rates and not convert that in the NRL.

He won't be NRLCEO relevant though. He wasn't a workhorse when he was younger at the Tigers and

Panthers and at 115kg, he won't become one now either. His injury Ben **MURDOCH**affected 2020 Super MASILA League stats (pictured) read 10 games, three tries, one try assist, one workhorse and zero metre eaters.

Former NRLCEO favourite **David Mead** will return to the NRL after three seasons in France for Catalans. The try scoring flyer added another 29 Super League tries to his 71 NRL tries to take his professional club career to 100 tries in total.



The Eels have finally landed a decent back-up hooker to Reed Mahoney in the Northern Beaches born *Joey Lussick*. Ray Stone will likely start as the utility in the Eels 17, but the brother of Darcy could work his way into that role and is a better starting hooker prospect should Mahoney get injured.

Whilst he only managed one game for the Sea Eagles in 2017, Lussick has grown in maturity and stature since his move to the UK.

His stats in the Super League last year were reasonable and speak of workhorse potential with a starting role. He played 13 games, scored a try, two line breaks, had three try assists, six workhorses but metre eaters. Although in 2019 he scored 12 tries in one season, so he can sniff Joey out a try. LUSSÍCK (pictured)

The Knights have looked to the future in signing two academy guns Bailey Hodgson and Dominic Young. Both 19 years old, and both with less than two first grade appearances under their This bloke is Josh belts. Hodgson's nephew! In a fascinating transition of generations, Bailey **HODGSON** Bailey Hodgson (pictured) is the nephew of Josh Hodgson. He is an exciting future prospect, but not a draft prospect for 2021. The 19 year old has signed a three year deal with the Knights, which shows they

England Academy representative *Harry Rushton* is also just 19 years old but is already making waves as a future first grade star. At 6"3' he has the height but still has to put meat on his 98kg frame.

In his only Super League game to date he made 41 tackles and had 11 carries. He is certainly a hard working back rower - typical of we've seen from England in recent vears. He is another project player for the Raiders and will play a season of U21's before he is considered first team standard. One for the future if you play in a keeper league. RUSHTON

THE BREAKDOWN

- Harry Grant was unsurprisingly a Round 1 selection this year after his dynamite performances last year. He will be a top five pick in most competitions.
- Jarrod Croker had a very off year last season with his equal lowest try scoring year ever (five). Round 2 was an early selection and he was the third kicker off the board. Nick is banking on him having a big turnaround and the Raiders scoring more points.
- Stephen Crichton was picked up in Round 3 which was a shock for the group. He had a standout year last year but an early selection when you have a lot quality centres unlike other positions.

He was selected as a kicking handcuff with Cleary by Matt which could justify the selection.

 Tyson Frizell was another one considered relatively early for his performances but considering Metre Eaters have been reduced from 150m to 125m this could increase his scoring.

- The first Tiger wasn't drafted until Round 6.
- Ryan James being drafted in Round 9 by Scott is a
 massive gamble considering his ACL injuries, but could
 pay off well based on his historical scoring when fit.
- Victor Radley dropped to Round 12 in the draft. He won't be on the top 200 list after only scoring 24 points after his injury last year after seven games, but he's so vital for the Roosters attack and defence.
- On reflection, Rob admitted that he drafted Ben
 Murdoch-Masila far too early in Round 13. He thought
 he should probably be in the spud pool.
- Alex Twal was surprisingly left to Round 14. He had
 an injury interrupted year in 2020 but is a rock solid
 workhorse when fit. He might have dropped so far due
 to solely being a Lock this year.
- The Lock position in general dropped quite low across the board in this draft.

Turning 21 in January of this year, Jordan Riki is officially a fully grown adult with a license to fuck up opposition forwards. The 190cm back rower has been waiting in the wings for a while and even made his rep debut for the Maori All Stars last year before debuting at club level.

Of the five matches Riki got to play last season, four were from the bench where he wasn't particularly NRLCEO relevant outside of a try and an almost workhorse. BUT in his fifth and final game of the season in round 20, Riki got the start and comfortably earned a WH with his 47 involvements. The Broncos could do worse than to pick Jordan Riki in the starting lineup.

The Mighty Milk fell to the eventual premiers in the preliminary final last season. Given their form midway through the season though, a prelim final may have superseded their expectations but no way would Ricky suggest that was the case.

Midway through the season, the Women's Weekly Bateman saga finally concluded with the Pommy backrower heading back to England. His departure will leave a sizable hole on the right edge while Nick Cotric's money move to the Dogs will also impact the right side.

However, it's not all doom and gloom in the Capital and in comes the big name of Ryan James from the Titans. Draftsters will tread warily though – many have been burned after two seasons destroyed by knee injuries - it remains to be seen if James is up for the new rigorous pace of the NRL.

For the CEO, the Raiders typically boast some strong draft prospects. Captain Croker's boots are always a valuable commodity along with his hunger for tries.

In the halves, the reigning Dally M Medallist Jack Wighton was excellent last season and his combination with George Williams turned out to be a raging success. Both are very good draft targets in their respective positions.

Up front, man mountain Josh Papalii had another wrecking ball season. Despite scoring four tries for the season, he was used sparingly by Coach Ricky and if the game is a blow out, he's the first to get a rest. That affects his workhorse and metre eating output.

Fresh off the injured list, Corey "the Horse" Horsburgh will return with the angry bloodnut's impact and passion vital for the Raiders' success. His return may push Joseph Tapine to the right edge where he'll face a battle with CHN to start each week.

At hooker, the rise of Tom Starling is not likely to put early pressure on the return of Josh Hodgson this season, but down the track, the Raiders look like they've got a Damien Cook clone on their hands – keep an eye out for the livewire rake (if he manages to beat a police charge and avoid jail

Overall, the Raiders have some holes that they need to fill and there's some serious competition for starting positions in the back row and on the wing. How Ricky decides to fill these gaps is anyone's guess but it could really determine who becomes a diamond in the rough, or ... a dud.

There are two young Raiders centres waiting in line for opportunity. Last year we highlighted Harley Smith-Shields who went on to play two first grade games. Matt Timoko is arguably the more exciting of the two prospects.

The young Kiwi also played two NRL games last year but with Croker racing the clock to play in Round 1, I expect 'Timoko time' in the left centre position. He has more pace than HSS and is a more unpredictable attacker. Something the Raiders have lacked in the centres since Joey Leilua left. With Croker returning from injury and Curtis Scott not setting the world alight, one of these young boys will get good game time.
