

Second, we've increased the club fees from \$10 to \$12 sitewide. We've been with TheBench for seven years now without an increase, but unfortunately the cost of running the site continues to rise.

A QUICK REFRESHER

Most people reading this are likely to be diehard NRLCEO fanatics with at least a couple years of experience. That being said, there is sure to be at least a few of you that are new to this and many more who could use a brush up on how to play.

Before we flood you with information in the rest of this season guide, take a second to look over everything below so that we're all starting off on the same foot.

WHAT IS NRLCEO?

NRLCEO is Australia's largest promotion/relegation draft for NRL fantasy football. Where Supercoach and NRL Fantasy assign prices to each player and give you a salary cap, NRLCEO prefers the draft approach. Every player is available to be in your team, but they're all unique. CEOs (that's you and the other players in your league) take turns to pick players, but once they've been picked, nobody else can use them.

AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST PROMOTION/RELEGATION DRAFT

The Legends of League Competition is our oldest public league and it is now in its twelfth year. It's the ultimate competition to pit yourself against the best of the best outside of your private leagues.

Such is the popularity of this competition that many of the teams have been returning since the first year. Still after 11 years, no team has ever won the Champions League twice. So the challenge is on for 2021 Champions The Fighting Mongooses, 2019 Champions NQ All Stars, and the 2017 champions Injury Brigade as they attempt to win for a second time.

Our Legends of League tournament is Australia's biggest promotion and relegation fantasy draft tournament.

The top tier is made up of ten teams - the top four from the 2021 Champions League and the six winners of the Legends of League Division 1 competitions. They all vye for the honour of being the champion of all champions, the highest honour in the NRLCEO world.

The second tier is made up of six Legends of League competitions with eight teams in each league. The winner of each of these competitions competes in the next year's Champions League. The bottom two teams are relegated to the third tier.

The third tier is made up of six qualifying leagues. There are eight teams in each competition and the Grand Finalists of each of these competitions get promoted to tier two the following year.

In each of these competitions, the top five play-off in the finals to crown the champion of each League. It is \$10 entry per team and the winners receive an awesome trophy. There are limited places available in the tier three competitions depending on who returns.



CHAMPIONS LEAGUE INTERVIEW

- WITH MICHAEL HANNA

Q. How long have you been playing NRLCEO?

A. 2011 - we had our first draft at the Spotted Cow in Toowoomba. Eight nutcases with terrible hangovers for the inaugural LCT Cup. Four of us remain from that original group and three of us were in the Champions League last year (and this year).

Q. How many times have you been in the Champions League?

A. This was my fourth attempt at the holy grail of NRLCEO.

Q. Is this your greatest victory of all?

A. It sits comfortable at number 2. The greatest of all was the Andrew Johns Final in 2019 when Nathan Cleary scored 34 points and inspired a JB Facebook rant and a very bitter message with my trophy!

Q. Do you have a standard draft strategy that you follow?

A. Draft position makes it tricky – first pick I try and take who I think is best available and then alternate forward/back filling my spine as a priority.

Q. Who was your first draft pick in the Champions League and were you happy with him?

A. Payne Haas at pick 10 – he was suspended for the first three games but did what was expected for the last half of the season.

Q. Who was the worst player you drafted in the Champions League in 2021?

A. I drafted Brenko Lee and he didn't even look like getting a start!

Q. What makes the Champions League different to other comps you play in?

A. Very few lapses in the draft and the boys are very forward focused early looking for consistent points.

Q. How was the pressure in the final few weeks?

A. Was fairly confident the final was going to be Magnets (Sam Roberts) and myself – we had skipped clear riding the Manly express and were both averaging 95+ for the season. He had me the first three times we went head to head but Tommy T got me home in the final.

Q. How did you feel when you realised you won the Champions League?

A. Relief to have finally climbed the NRLCEO Everest.

Q. In ten seasons of the Champions League there have been ten separate winners. How do you plan on being the first ever person to win it twice?

A. Hope that Tommy T falls to Round 8 again! Need some luck in this one to go back to back looking at the list of past champions.




Q. Who will be your biggest rival in the Champions League in 2022?

A. Is JB here this year? Simo & Happy Trails from the LCT Cup I take joy in beating but think it has to be Magnets after last year.

SUPPORTERS LEAGUE SCOUTING

Traditionally in our Supporters Leagues you get to pick your team from real life and draft six of their players, as well as the team's kicking points, before anyone else gets the chance. We found that some teams who typically flail down the bottom of the ladder don't always have six players worth picking, so we've decided to tweak the rules a bit.

Starting last year, all NRLCEO players in a Supporters League now only pick four players plus their team's kicking points. This should help even out the teams and make the draft that much more interesting.

If you have the Melbourne Storm for example, then you're likely to pick up Harry Grant, Ryan Papenhuyzen, perhaps Cameron Munster, and Jahrome Hughes. In years gone past you might have picked up a Bromwich and a winger as well, but now the poor bastard who has the Tigers might actually have a shot!

BRISBANE BRONCOS (TUX)

1. PAYNE HAAS 2. PATRICK CARRIGAN 3. KOTONI STAGGS **4.ADAM REYNOLDS**

Haas is the best forward in the game with the biggest motor and is still four years away from his prime. Coming off an ACL it would be easy to dismiss Carrigan but he tackles himself to a standstill. Staggs is easily the most devastating ball runner in the game, and will hand cuff Reynolds who finally gives them some direction.

CANTERBURY BULLDOGS (ADZ)

1. JOSH ADDO-CARR 2. JOSH JACKSON 3. LUKE THOMPSON **4.MATT BURTON**

You can't go past Addo-Carr for scoring potential. Jackson and Thompson will get you a couple of WH every week, then the last slot is a wild card.

My fourth pick is Matt Burton. Safe to say, he won't reach the heights of last year but he will feature heavily in attacking stats. Paul Vaughan and TPJ were also good options I considered.

CANBERRA RAIDERS (JB)

1. JACK WIGHTON 2.JOSH PAPALII 3. CHARNZE NICOLL-KLOKSTAD **4.HUDSON YOUNG**

What a sad state of affairs these Raiders selections are this season. There is no clear stand-out for me. and only Hudson Young (#7) and Jordan Rapana (#7) made the top spots in their positions.

I'm concerned that Papa might slow down, but he's been pumping out 80+ since 2015 so I'm going to back him in to do it again.

CRONULLA SHARKS (DAN)

1. CAM MCINNES 2. WILL KENNEDY 3. NICHO HYNES **4.BLAYKE BRAILEY**

Put McInnes down for a WH every week. Kennedy lit up the competition last year and Hynes could be risky, however its worth it.

Lastly, the new, faster rules are made for the younger Brailey. He should have plenty of energy to finally deliver on his attacking potential this season.

(NICK)

I chose Brimmo as I reckon he will kill it in the halves this year.

Hopefully he stays injury free so that he can get a good combo going with this young spine!

I also thought about Corey Thompson's metre eaters, but Brimmo just had more to offer.

MELBOURNE STORM (BRENDAN)

1. RYAN PAPENHUYZEN 2. HARRY GRANT 3. BRANDON SMITH **4.JAHROME HUGHES**

This was bloody hard! This team is stacked and it felt so weird to leave Cameron Munster out but he's a frustrating CEO player.

He only had three scores in double figures. He's just not that consistent, so I opted for the consistency of Jahrome Hughes instead.

(BEAVER)

1. KALYN PONGA 2. DANIEL SAIFITI 3. MITCH BARNETT 4.ENARI TUALA

This was really tough considering how bad the Knights backline is. Ponga is the most obvious choice and should be our top scorer this year.

Saifiti and Barnett get their workhorses and not a lot more, but the increase to five points was tasty. Tuala was my last choice and based on him playing on the left outside Ponga.

MANLY SEA EAGLES (RYAN)

1. TOM TRBOJEVIC 2. DALY CHERRY-EVANS 3. REUBEN GARRICK **4.JASON SAAB**

Tom and Cherry speak for themselves and will score more points than any other NRLCEO duo.

The guestions are at slots #3 and #4. Manly have no standout NRLCEO forwards, so ask yourself which players you might be kicking yourself for passing over... It has to be the top try scoring wingers for me.

NEW ZEALAND WARRIORS (SCOTT)

1. REECE WALSH 2.SHAUN JOHNSON 3. ADDIN FONUA-BLAKE **4.EUAN AITKEN**

With RTS gone and Tohu returning from his ACL injury halfway through the season, it's slim pickings at the Warriors this season.

The return of the prodigal son means Johnson is an automatic pick. Walsh and AFB had strong perfomances last year, and Aitken was a bit of a revelation shifting to the back row.

NTH QUEENSLAND COWBOYS (MIG)

1. JASON TAUMALOLO 2. REECE ROBSON 3. MURRAY TUALAGI **4.HAMISO TABUAI-FIDOW**

Lock me in for the spoon this year unless I can find some talent in the draft. I went with 'The Hammer' with my last pick - he could do some damage with his electrifying speed! It was seriously hard to pick four CEO relevant Cows and none of the four I've picked get me excited one little bit.

It could be a loooong season for the Cowboys.

Brown is probably your best option for the fourth spot. Not only is he more productive than someone like Ryan Matterson; covering the lock position is much harder than covering the second row.

Maika Sivo is normally worth considering but is still recovering from an ACL injury which makes him unviable for a top four spot.

SOUTH SYDNEY RABBITOHS (MIKEY)

1. DAMIEN COOK

2. CAMERON MURRAY

3. CODY WALKER

4.LATRELL MITCHELL

This is the same four as last season, and why change a winning formula?

The last position is a toss of the coin between Latrell and AJ. Despite being the top try scorer last year, Latrell is far more dangerous over a full season and so gets the nod in my team. Very strong core.

SYDNEY ROOSTERS (BONA)

1. JAMES TEDESCO

2. LUKE KEARY

2. ANGUS CRICHTON

3. ANGUS CRICHTON

4.SAM VERRILLS

So much excitement around the Roosters this year. Keary may start the season slowly, but he'll come good once he gets his groove back.

Quality 80 minute hookers will be hard to find this year, so even though Verrills will likely share minutes with Watson, he's pretty busy and gets a workhorse most weeks.

PENRITH PANTHERS (SHERIFF)

1. NATHAN CLEARY

2.BRIAN TO'O

3. JAMES FISHER-HARRIS

4.ISAAH YEO

Nathan Cleary - no brainer. Brian To'o - for his ME alone, everything else is a bonus. JFH - big minute FR are hard to find. Fourth pick is between Yeo and Api. Yeo was consistent all year last year, and no reason that will change. Api was up and down and may share more minutes with Kenny in preparation for 2023. Yeo it is!

ST GEORGE DRAGONS (ROB)

1. BEN HUNT

2.ZAC LOMAX

3. JACK DE BELIN

4.ANDREW MCCULLOUGH

Hunt is the primary playmaker and will be involved in plenty of try assists. Lomax is always dangerous and will be good for attacking stats.

Finally, I've gone for two safe WH options which is important with them going to five points. Keep an eye on where Mbye lands and if it impacts McCullough's minutes.

WESTS TIGERS (BIG T)

3. DAINE LAURIE

4.OLIVER GILDART

Alex Twal is coming of age, and this year Maguire will have him hitting his peak. Nofa is the man that keeps the Tigers purring through big metres and is good for a try and 20.

Daine Laurie will push your score along nicely, and Gildart is an international signing and a mildly unknown commodity in NRLCEO.



SUPER LEAGUE SCOUTING

Last year there were just six players heading down under and this year there are only four!

With the craziness of COVID and the risk of not being able to see their families for a number of years, there is only one Brit heading to Oz and three others returning to the NRL.

Jackson Hastings left as a boy and returns to the NRL as a man. People will have plenty of views on this bloke as a bloke, but I can tell you he has matured a hell of a lot and will be an absolute asset to the Tigers for years to come.

On the pitch, Hastings had 24 tries and 74 try assists over Jackson **HASTINGS** three seasons in the Super (pictured) League with Salford and Wigan. In 2021 he had four tries, 17 DONIO assists and two field goals. There's absolutely no doubt in my mind that he gets a starting gig at the Tigers. Worth a punt

as a low, two kicker point half.

I look forward to seeing how **Oliver Gildart** settles in at the Tigers. You can stick your "Pommy backs don't succeed in the NRL" sentiments up your arse Deano. This bloke is cut from a different cloth.

Oliver GILDART (pictured)

Statistically, he's not a world beating centre with 59 tries in 133 games for Wigan. Add another 41 try assists to that tally, as well as averaging a metre eater each game and you've got yourself a player. He has three English caps to his name and one for Great Britain but at 25 he has time on his side.

You can probably sleep on this bloke too. Most people in your drafts won't touch him because he's a centre and he's a Pom. Stash him late and you won't regret it.

Gildart's English teammate **George Burgess** returns to Australia after an unsuccessful stint with Wigan which saw him play just eight games over two seasons after signing a big three year deal with the powerhouse.

After 150 appearances with the Bunnies, he returned to the UK as a marquee player but a hip injury stunted his plans to dominate Super League. It was an itch he needed to scratch as he went straight from a Bradford Academy player to a Bunnies player as a youngster.

Don't get too excited about drafting this big rig though, as George hasn't been NRLCEO relevant since 2015 when he made 15 workhorses. Over the next four seasons he only managed six workhorses in total!

So a nice "representative level" pick-up for

the Dragons who continue to build Dad's Army in Wollongong.


Last, but certainly not least, the Fijian King **Kevin Naiqama** returns as a 32 year old with three years of the Super League under his belt and three Premiership rings on his finger.



Kevin NAIQAMA (pictured)

Capped 19 times for Fiji, but despite playing for over a decade, he has just 178 caps to his name and therefore still has some fuel left in the tank as a Mr Fix It for the Chooks. He can play wing, centre and fullback and will likely replace Brett Morris as Trent Robinson's backline utility.

A few players of note who we previewed in last year's Super League Scouting are worth exploring though. **Dominic Young** ended up getting capped six times for the Knights and is a good chance to grab the Knights



But it's another young Englishman, *Bayley Hodgson*, that's worth keeping an eye on as a potential keeper. The nephew of Josh Hodgson is just 19 and if Ponga decides to ride with the Dolphins, could be the Knights long term fullback.

Another young Englishman, *Harry Rushton* at the Raiders is just 20 years old and is knocking all of his fitness and strength numbers out of the park in Canberra.

A back rower/middle forward, he can run for days and made a workhorse in NSW Cup in nine out of his ten appearances in 2021. The Raiders back row is stacked, but he will no doubt get his chance in this wacky COVID season.

BETRAYERS

THE BREAKDOWN

- By the time the first Raiders or Tigers player was drafted in round 7, eight Storm players had already been chosen. Even the Dragons and Cowboys had a pick by then!
- Koroisau (Rd 4), Matterson (Rd 6), Jurbo (Rd 9), McGuire (Rd 14), and Jazz (Rd 20) were all drafted late based on their past NRLCEO reputations.
- After an injury affected season Luke Keary dropped to pick #19 and was given credit from many on the board when Jez snapped him up.
- For the first year in many years, there was no lock for first pick and **Nathan Cleary** got snapped up just ahead of **Tom Trbojevic**.
- Adam Reynolds was a surprise second round pick and it was noted by the group. Yes he's the highest percentage kicker in the competition, but he is an unknown quantity at the struggling Broncos.

- Lots of punts taken this year, which indicates teams aren't easy to predict their starting line ups.
- Halfbacks were high in demand and fullbacks and kickers went early this year. There were a lot of five-eighths left at the end of the draft, but not many halfbacks.
- The stocks on *Kalyn Ponga* have slipped to pick #15 on the back of uncertainty around whether or not he will have the kicking tee.
- There's a big difference between the first five draft picks last year and this year. Thanks to V'Landys we've gone from four forwards and a half in 2021 to five backs in 2022.
- It feels like there's a lot of players moving with a chance to flourish. Guys like Matt Burton and Nicho Hynes aren't stuck out of position anymore.
- Looks like you can sleep on front rowers and back rowers a lot more this year than any other. You can always sleep on centres.

WHAT HAPPENED

Flying high midway through the season, the late season fade which ultimately saw the Broncos lose their last three games to miss the finals by two points had fans seething.

2022 was a definite rollercoaster season for all involved – off field dramas derailed their season and ultimately the white flag was shown when they were mauled by the Tigers in Round 20 and were destroyed by the Storm and Eels in the latter rounds...

PERSONNEL CHANGES

Reece Walsh returns to give the Broncos some consistency at the back. A whole host of deadwood has departed Brisbane.

Jock Madden has talked it up but looks unlikely to slot into the halves straight away with Ezra Mam improving with every game he plays.

CEO DRAFT TARGETS

Reynolds runs the show but at 32 years old, he's no sprightly foal. The Broncos are a different team with him on the field and his kicking and try assist ability still makes him a handy HB option.

Payne Haas continues to top the PR draft wish list and if his head is in the game and his heart remains with the Broncos, he'll again play big minutes. Patrick Carrigan is the other big worker in the team and if he avoids injury, should be up for a huge season of workhorses.

As usual, the Broncos love going to the edges with Corey Oates and Selwyn Cobbo likely to trouble the scorers more often than not, if the Broncos can get on a roll...

THE MAIL

The Broncos showed signs that a return to the top 8 is likely this season. Hooker is still a troublesome position for them with Billy Walters and Corey Paix likely to battle it out for a start in the 9.

The backline can be classy on its day but quite simply, plenty will be resting on the addition of Walsh to ignite the likes of Staggs and Farnworth. The pack boasts a nice mix of youth and experience and if the squad can buy in to Coach Kevvie's philosophies, then the Broncos should return to better days in 2023...





CEO DRAFT TARGETS



THE MAIL

Sadly, the Sharkies look like a team on the rise. They have recruited intelligently and have looked to bolster their areas of deficiency from recent seasons.

Purely off the back of their new recruits, the Sharks seem certain to improve and Fitzgibbon already has the respect of the playing group. If the trials indicate that the Sharks have turned a corner in attack, the boots and skills of Hynes and Trindall could be prime CEO targets...

CEO DRAFT TARGETS

WHAT HAPPENED

The Storm were one of the teams to beat again last season and for a franchise who sets such lofty standards each and every year, bowing out in a closely fought preliminary final to the eventual premiers would have been a hard one to swallow.

The headache selections of 2021 are not likely to plague the Storm's season this year though, with the spine seemingly set in stone and depth never an issue for the Melbourne men.

PERSONNEL CHANGES

The Storm will boast a new look to their starting team with Josh Addo-Carr, Dale Finucane, Nicho Hynes, and Brenko Lee the big names who have moved on. Incoming is Xavier Coates and he's a ready made fit to replace Addo-Carr. Nick Meaney will also push for a starting spot but there's plenty of competition for that second wing position.

Coach Bellamy has a few headaches in the pack to sort out with Brandon Smith signing for the Roosters for 2023, and Nelson Asofa-Solomona and Tui Kamikamica both unlikely to play for an extended period. 'Cheese' is likely to play lock, giving Grant full rein at hooker.

THE MAIL




